Purpose: To encourage innovative American history, civics and government, and geography instruction; learning strategies; and professional development activities and programs for teachers, principals, or other school leaders—particularly such instruction, strategies, activities, and programs that benefit students from low-income backgrounds and other underserved populations.

Eligibility: Public, private, and state-controlled institutions of higher education; and nonprofits with or without 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education).

Funding: \$19.8 million; award amounts unlisted.

[Conservation Innovation Grants \(CIG\) On-Farm Conservation Innovation Trials](#)

Purpose: To support projects addressing at least one of the following priorities: irrigation management technologies, new and innovative grazing land management solutions, nutrient management, and soil health demonstration trials.

Eligibility: State, county, city, township, or special district governments; public, private, and state-controlled institutions of higher education; nonprofits with or without 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education); small businesses; for-profit organizations other than small businesses; and Native American tribal governments and organizations.

Funding: \$50 million; awards between \$250,000 and \$5 million.

[OVW Fiscal Year 2026 Grants to Support Families in the Justice System \(Justice for Families\) Program](#)

Purpose: To improve the response of the civil and criminal justice system to families with a history of domestic/dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking, or in cases involving child sexual abuse.

Eligibility: State, county, city, or township governments; nonprofits with 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education); and Native American tribal governments and organizations.

Funding: \$16 million; awards between \$650,000 and \$800,000.

Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant

Purpose: To assist recipients to address their own unique public health needs and challenges with evidence-based, innovative, and community-driven methods to address local priorities.

Eligibility: State governments and federally recognized Native American tribal governments.

Funding: \$156 million; award amounts unlisted.

Project Rental Assistance Program of Section 811 Supportive Housing for Persons with Disabilities

Purpose: To increase access to new and existing affordable supportive housing units for persons with disabilities.

Eligibility: State governments.

Funding: \$158 million; awards up to \$9.875 million.

Research Grants for Preventing Interpersonal Violence and Suicide Among Youth and Young Adults

Purpose: To support research to evaluate innovative programs, practices, or policies to address risk for interpersonal violence and suicide among groups experiencing a high burden of these issues.

Eligibility: Unrestricted.

Funding: \$9.6 million; awards up to \$400,000.

Training Program for Federal TRIO Programs

Purpose: To train the staff and leadership personnel employed in, participating in, or preparing for employment in, projects funded under the Federal TRIO Programs, to improve project operation.

Eligibility: Public, private, and state-controlled institutions of higher education; and nonprofits with or without 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education).

Funding: \$4.1 million; awards between \$550,000 and \$1.1 million.

Veterans Cemetery Grants

Purpose: To establish, expand, or improve Veteran's cemeteries that are owned and operated by states, U.S. territories, federally recognized tribal governments on trust land owned by, or held in trust for, tribal organization or counties.

Eligibility: State governments and federally recognized Native American tribal governments.

Funding: \$60 million; award amounts unlisted.

Deadline: 7/1/2026
