Halbrook: "Thank you. I rise today to speak about a matter that goes at the very heart of our democracy: election integrity. Last week, Congress passed the SAVE Act, a reminder that protecting the sanctity of our elections is not optional, it is essential. Here in Illinois, however, we have seen preventable failures that undermine public confidence in our system. In the Republican primary for governor, voters across our state are facing chaos in five counties. Lake, Kane, McHenry, Boone, and Ogle ballots included a candidate who, according to the State Board of Elections final certification, should not have appeared. Voters in some counties are casting ballots with Joe Severino's name while others are voting without him. Meanwhile, early voting has been delayed in our most populous counties, including Cook, giving some voters longer access and others less. And then there's Champaign County. The ballots for Ted Dabrowski were printed with his name misspelled as Tad. The county clerk, Aaron Ammons, refuses to reprint the ballots or halt voting, leaving voters' intentions at risk. These problems were entirely preventable. The State Board of Elections, which sends ballot certifications and oversees election procedures, failed to give clear guidance. They issued multiple conflicting certifications, ignored pending litigation, and failed to direct counties to universally delay voting until all disputes were resolved. Their mismanagement is a proximate cause of the confusion we are seeing today. Mr. Speaker, election integrity is not partisan, it is fundamental. Every voter in Illinois deserves equal access, accurate ballots, and a system they can trust. I urge the

State Board of Elections to take immediate corrective action, and I call on the county clerks to follow the law and ensure voters voices are properly counted. Anything less is unacceptable. Thank you."

Speaker West: "The Chair recognizes Leader Mah for the purpose of an announcement."

Mah: "Thank you... thank you, Mr. Speaker. Democrats would request a caucus meeting starting at 12:30 in Room 114. And I would encourage all Democrats to attend for some very important business. Thank you."

Clerk Hollman: "House Bill 598, a Bill for an Act concerning government. This bill was read a second time previously. No Committee Amendments. Floor Amendments 1 and 2 have been approved for consideration. Floor Amendment #1 is offered... offered by Representative Delgado."

Tarver: "Floor Amendment #1 is a very small change but an important one that pushes back the Cook County property tax sale date from March until December of 2026."

Speaker West: "Leader Tarver moves adoption of Floor Amendment #1. All those in favor say 'aye'; all those opposed say 'nay.' In the opinion of the Chair, the 'ayes' have it. And the amendment is adopted. Any further amendments, Mr. Clerk?"

Clerk Hollman: "Floor Amendment #2 is offered by Representative Tarver."

Speaker West: "Leader Tarver on Floor Amendment #2."

Tarver: "Floor Amendment #2 is a narrow technical cleanup related to unintended consequences. Under the prior law... excuse me, under the law, Zion is required to abate at least 75% of certain grant funds back to taxpayers. But the problem is, under the PTELL calculations, when they do that refund, it permanently reduces their aggregate extension base."

Speaker West: "Leader Tarver moves adoption of Floor Amendment #2. All those in favor say 'aye'; those opposed say 'nay.' In the opinion of the Chair, the 'ayes' have it. And the amendment is adopted. Any further amendments, Mr. Clerk?"

Clerk Hollman: "No further amendments. No motions are filed."

Speaker West: "Third Reading. Mr. Clerk, read the bill, please."

Clerk Hollman: "House Bill 598, a Bill... a Bill for an Act concerning government. Third Reading of this House Bill."

Speaker West: "Leader Tarver is recognized."

Tarver: "Again, on amendment 1, this is to push back the Cook County property tax sale date from March of 2026 to December of 2026. I'm happy to answer any questions."

Sosnowski: "We had this in committee. Our Members were generally supportive of this. We certainly understand the pushing back of the timeline on the tax sale. I'd caution some Members, while I'll be supportive of this, in regards to Zion, we certainly understand that it's located just in regards to the decommissioned nuclear power plant. This does create some possibility in the future, though unlikely, that, you know, local governments could tax at a higher rate to make up that difference, even though we understand now that they're receiving a grant to cover that. So, I just caution some of our Members to be careful of that. But otherwise, thank you very much."

Speaker West: "For discussion, Leader Ugaste."

Ugaste: "Thank you. Will the sponsor yield?"

Speaker West: "He indicates he will."

Ugaste: "Thank you. Leader Tarver, the... the bill has two amendments. One deals with Cook County property tax sales. Is that correct?"

Tarver: "That is correct, amendment #1."

Ugaste: "OK. And I understand the desire to do that and... and the reason for it. Where are we in... in getting something passed so that this issue can be resolved in total? Do you know?"

Tarver: "I have a little bit of knowledge about that, so I appreciate you asking. We've been talking about this issue for quite some time, as you know, since the U.S. Supreme Court said that how we do things is unconstitutional. I personally had quite a few stakeholder meetings during veto. I also

convened meetings in November and December, and we've been working through... we're just not at a point now where we'd have a bill that would be able to move before the March date. But the goal is to move a bill that overhauls the property tax sale system and... and how we do it prior to leaving here at the end of May. So, that... that has been my charge, and I believe that we'll... we'll get there."

Ugaste: "OK. Thank you. I appreciate that because that... that's very helpful to know instead of just extending this out. And then, on the Zion portion, will that allow for the taxing bodies to collect on an increased assessment and push property taxes off on other taxpayers or have them have to pay the... the increased levy amount?"

Tarver: "I certainly would not characterize it that way. My understanding is Zion is in a tough position. Either they take the grant money and they hurt themselves, or they don't take the grant money and they get no relief for their residents right now. So, I think this is focused on trying to ensure that they don't lose \$16 million for schools, parks, and... and other... and other municipal entities."

Ugaste: "OK. Thank you."

Speaker West: "Leader Tarver to close."

Tarver: "I urge 'aye' vote."

Speaker West: "The question is, 'Shall House Bill 598 pass?' All in favor vote 'aye'; all opposed vote 'nay.' The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Jane Bolin was a groundbreaking attorney who went on to become the first African American female judge in the United States. After graduating from Wellesley College at the top of her class, a fiercely determined Bolin enrolled in Yale Law School. Despite facing blatant racism and social hostility on campus, Bolin graduated in 1931, becoming the first Black woman to earn a degree from the prestigious institution and passed the New York state bar exam in 1932. Jane Bolin was the first Black woman to join the New York City Bar Association and the first Black woman to join the New York City Law Department. In 1939,

Jane Bolin became the first Black female judge in the United States, serving on New York's domestic relations court for 40 years. She fought against racial discrimination in child welfare, adoption, and juvenile justice, ensuring fair treatment for all. Her pioneering role set a precedent for Black women in law. As the first Black woman in my family to attend and graduate college, attend and graduate law school, become a member of the Illinois State Bar, and now serve as a member of this legislative body, Jane Bolin blazed the trail for me and all Black women in law. Thank you."

Speaker West: "Representative Weaver, for what reason do you rise?"

Weaver: "Ladies and gentlemen, I rise today to recognize one of the greatest collections of Americans ever assembled to defend American interests and pride on a global scale as we advance our missions of freedom, justice, liberty, and victory. Of course, I'm talking about the United States of America Olympic gold hockey medal team, led by captain Auston Matthews; lockdown goalie, whose name I can't spell, but I can yell, Connor Hellebuyck; and, of course, great American patriot, living legend Jack Hughes. The boys were absolutely buzzing from puck drop, full forecheck, full backcheck, full paycheck. Our Americans started off strong as Matt Boldly pushed our champions to a 1-0 lead with a slick backhand finish on a solo rush, assisted by Auston Matthews and Quinn Hughes. We were getting pucks deep, bodies to the net, and doing cardio the hard way. In the second period, we welcomed

The syrup soldiers had a good push, but Connor Hellebuyck responded to the Canadians the Canadian way, politely saying, 'No, thank you. Not today. Have a safe flight home, eh.' Then came overtime. In three-on-three play, Zach Werenski stripped a Canadian defender, fed living legend Jack Hughes streaking down the ice as Hughes buried a wrister through the opposing syrup soldiers' five hole. Good night. God bless. Have a nice plane ride home. That's exactly how you draw it up on the whiteboard: strip the puck, sauce the pass, bar down. Everybody goes bananas. This wasn't a skill issue, it was a will issue. And the boys needed a Zamboni to drag their golden teeth off the ice. It was, without a doubt, the greatest sports finish since November 2, 2016. Go Cubs. In the aftermath of global.. of the global display of American dominance, living legend Jack Hughes perfectly stated through a bloody mouth and two missing chiclets, 'This is all about our country right now. I love the USA. I love my teammates. It's unbelievable. The USA Hockey brotherhood is so strong. I'm so proud to be an American.' That's a great Canadian team, but we are USA. Let's go, America. Hockey is our sport now. Thank you."
