RE: Officer-Worn Body Camera Reporting

To whom it may concern:

Below is the 2025 annual report submitted by the Elmhurst Police Department in compliance with **50 ILCS 706/10-25**.

1) The Elmhurst Police Department is a municipal law enforcement agency in DuPage County, which is 74 sworn officers. The Elmhurst Police Department consists of three divisions: Operations, Investigations, and Administration. Within Operations and Investigations are, where nearly all the sworn officers are assigned. Every sworn officer in the department is assigned to have an officer-worn body camera. Cameras are also assigned to our non-sworn, civilian, service officers.

2) During calendar year 2025, there were 93 officer-worn body cameras held in inventory by the Elmhurst Police Department. Body worn cameras are also issued to our civilian service officers. During the reporting period, 74 sworn officer-worn body cameras were assigned to sworn officers for use during law enforcement operations.

3) There were zero reported technical issues or malfunctions associated with officer-worn body cameras in 2025 in the performance of duties that caused data/video to be lost.

4) The following is a brief description of the officer-worn body camera review process conducted by supervisors at the Elmhurst Police Department.

A . Department members utilize the officer-worn body camera consistent with police department directives.

B . Recordings are assigned in Evidence.com to the member who created the recordings.

C. Supervisors are assigned to regularly monitor and review all the digital files within Evidence.com to ensure they are properly identified and categorized. When a digital file is not categorized, the officer is made aware of the situation so that it can be categorized.

C. An investigation is initiated when a staff member determines that an officer-worn body camera is missing or lost.

D. The distribution, charging, and uploading of the officer-worn body cameras and their digital files are consistent with police department directives.

E. Officers who reviewed an officer-worn body camera recording prior to writing a report document this information in the narrative portion of the police report.

F. Monthly, supervisors review both officer-worn body camera and in-car camera recordings, if applicable. Supervisors review (2) incidents per officer per month.

The reviews are performed to ensure officers utilize the body-worn cameras in compliance with police department policy and procedures. This review process is documented in a computer file designed to conduct random body-worn camera video review and provide feedback to the officer.

There is no other relevant information related to the administration of the officer-worn body cameras to report.
