2025 Burbank Police Department ILETSB Body-Worn Camera Report

- **Number of Body-Worn Cameras:** On May 3, 2023, the Burbank Police Department implemented its body-worn camera program with 20 cameras and 40 interchangeable batteries. In July 2025, the original cameras were replaced with the newest model, along with 40 new interchangeable batteries.
- **Number of Officers:** In 2025, 46 full-time Burbank Police Officers utilized body-worn cameras.
- **Technical Issues:** In 2022, the Burbank Police Department entered into a five-year leasing agreement with its service provider for body-worn cameras. Under the agreement, when a camera becomes defective, a service ticket is submitted through the provider's customer portal, after which a replacement unit is shipped to the Department. The defective device is then returned to the service provider.

In 2025, two body-worn cameras were removed from service and returned after failing to boot and becoming stuck in system recovery mode. One body-worn camera was also removed from service and returned after video recordings displayed a green screen with purple lines. Additionally, three body-worn camera batteries were removed from service and returned due to the back panels separating from the battery housing.

- **Supervisor Review Process:** In accordance with Burbank Police Department policy, supervisors are authorized to review relevant body-worn camera recordings when investigating allegations of misconduct, recognizing meritorious conduct, or when such review assists in evaluating a member's performance. If a supervisor reviews body-worn camera footage prior to completing a report or other documentation, the review must be noted within the report or accompanying records.
