On behalf of the 7th District and as a proud Habesha and as myself, the grandson and grand grandchild of mountain dwellers in Ethiopia from the Gondar region. I'm honored to share this proud heritage and shine a light on and give flowers to the extended Ethiopian and Eritrean community throughout the State of Illinois, and certainly in the 7th district, which I'm proud to represent and those across the country. The 130th anniversary of the Battle of Azwa not only offers inspiration to those of African descent, but for all freedom loving people everywhere, now and for generations to come.
